TEACHER NOTES

Health & Safety - Staying Safe on the Railway

Contextual Summary

This resource is for upper key stage 2 students who are covering health and safety and identifying risks in certain situations as part of Personal, Social, Health & Economic Education on the 2014 National Curriculum.

The resource allows students who visit Isle of Wight Steam Railway to engage with the health and safety aspects of this environment, by identifying risks, asking and answering questions, and thinking about their own responses to potential danger.

Task Implementation

This task can be introduced to students before their visit to Isle of Wight Steam Railway. Before they arrive students should have an understanding of what Health & Safety is and why it is an important and ever-present aspect of our lives.

When on site at the railway, students can then apply what they already know about health and safety, answering questions on the sheet as they move around the venue. This will focus students' attention on the key areas for learning. Students will learn about how dangers are prevalent everywhere and that health and safety can protect us if we think 'safety first'. They will be learning and understanding core skills in a real-life situation.

Ability Levels

There are 3 versions of this resource intended for lower, middle and higher ability students in upper key stage 2.

However, the resource can be adapted by teachers for other ability groups or younger students for stretch and challenge if required.

Before the visit, students will need to know about health and safety as a concept and why it is is important to everyone's everyday lives. Discussions about the railway environment and potential hazards may be useful.
