TASK 1: Look at the old map of The Model Village on page 2 and use the key to answer the questions below:

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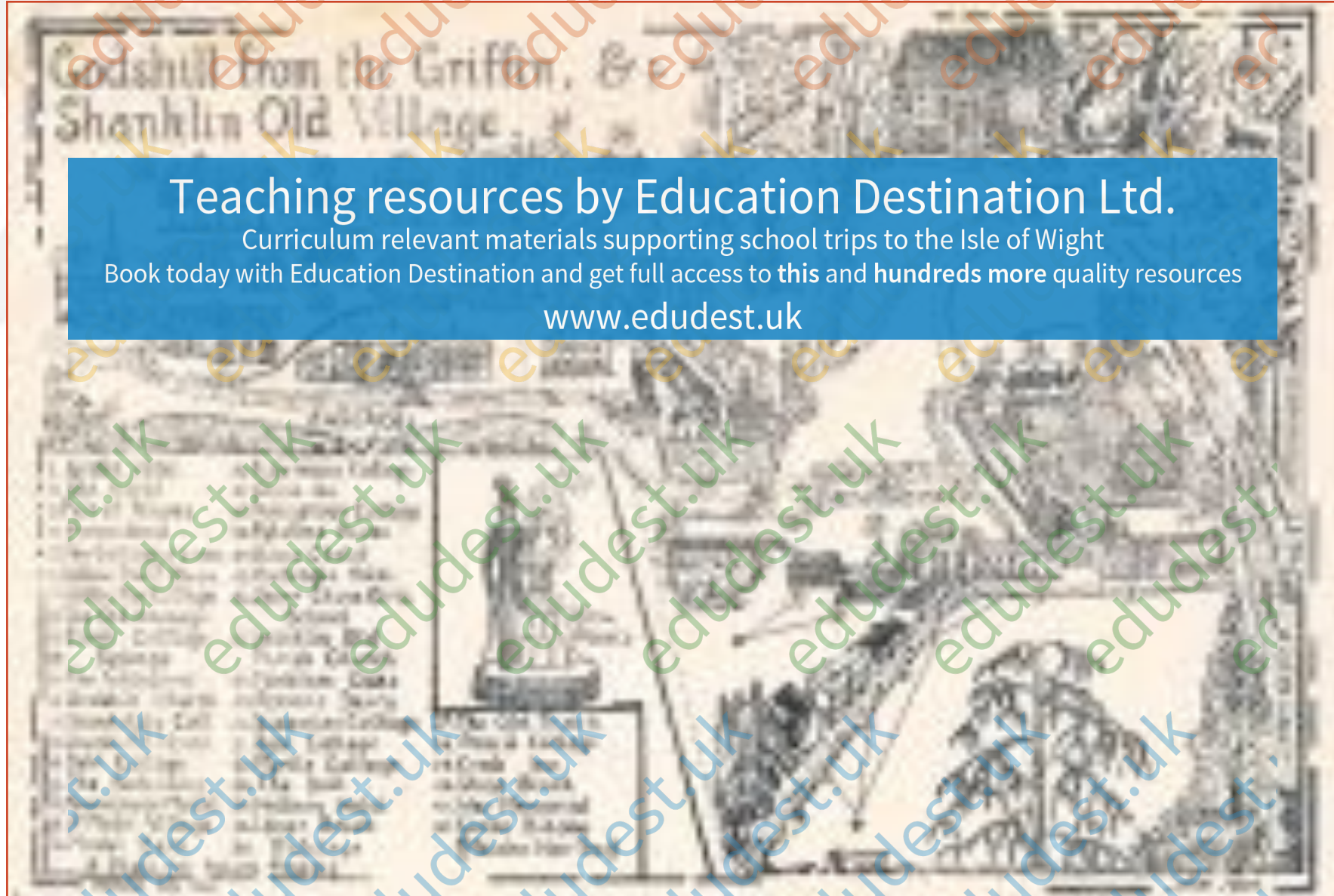
1. There are two churches. What are their names?
